Volunteering - Saltire Awards

Saltire Awards are the Scottish Government's National Youth Volunteer Awards. The awards recognise and celebrate the commitment, contribution and achievements of young volunteers in Scotland. They are aimed at young people aged 12 - 25 who provide support to their communities and good causes. Young people gain nationally recognised certificates, signed by Scottish Government Ministers, for the different amounts of volunteering they do.

There is a tutorial video below which explains the process for signing up for a personal Saltire account. You will need the name, email address, and contact number of the manager who will oversee your volunteering (e.g guides leader, charity shop manager, sports coach etc.). Please note, there is no limit to the number of volunteering roles you can add. Once you have signed up, please inform Miss Gilbride.

If you are volunteering <u>within</u> school (helping at extracurricular clubs, adopting the role of Mental Health Ambassadors, supporting classes etc.) you should log your hours in the logbook provided by Miss Gilbride. At the end of the academic year, you will be presented with your Saltire certificate. This certificate will include a claim code, as highlighted in the video, you can add this to your personal account.
